CWTC is starting the 4th season of gardening with plans for a greater variety of produce from the Dorchester and Twin Oaks gardens. In 2015 CWTC involved over 50 consumers in the program with plans for greater participation in 2016. CWTC



consumers have the opportunity to learn about growing and distribution of produce from seed to table. CWTC is again partnering with the gitm Foundation and CWTC will be a stop for the Tri-County Fresh Food Hub Mobile Food Van every Friday from 8 to 9AM. All produce from CWTC gardens will be sold to the public Friday mornings and at the Peoria Riverfront Market monthly; distributed to CWTC consumers in need; or donated to the gitm Foundation Grow it Forward program.
